



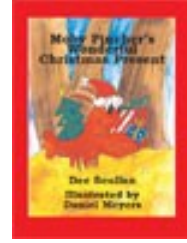

CRAWFISH TALE'S TEACHER'S GUIDE GEOGRAPHY GLE# GRADE 2 &3

Objectives: The students will understand the function and use of a map using cardinal direction and the compass rose to locate places on maps[G-1A-E1]

Materials: Book: Any Moby Pincher book
Map: Map drawing of Moby's Crawfish Town
Map: Map of Louisiana
Moby: Plastic Crawfish rendition of Moby

Introduction: Moby is a giant crawfish that lives in Crawfish Town, USA. Explain that children will use the Moby model to find certain locations in Crawfish Town.

Procedure:

1. Read Any Moby Pincher Book – children may act the story out using props, included, as story is read.
2. Display an outline map of LA that includes a title, directional indicator, a scale and map key
3. Students will (a) title Moby map
(b) place compass rose on map
(c) make a legend containing map key and scale

Closing: Teacher will read the Moby Pincher Book and students will use the Moby Crawfish Town map to integrate geography and language arts. Students will navigate Moby model through Crawfish Town by using cardinal directions.

Enrichment: Students will read the LA map and answer questions attached

Assessment: Teacher will observe the student's map and have a discussion on aspects of Crawfish Town and its geography. Discuss mapping fiction and real life.
